MORE FACTS ABOUT TRAFFIC, NOISE AND DUST

We realize that our industry can create higher levels of traffic, road dust, noise and even bright light that can disrupt your routine. Members of the Lochend Industry Producers Group are committed to reducing these nuisances as much as possible, and have identified a set of best practices to help do so.

When drilling is underway, the initial level of activity is, for the most part, temporary in nature. Individual wells generally take about 45 days to drill and complete, and once they are in production, traffic, dust and noise is reduced significantly.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

No rig moves are undertaken during school bus hours. All employees and contractors are required to adhere to posted speed limits. When possible, large or slow moving equipment is moved during off-peak hours.



ROAD MAINTENANCE

Each LIPG company has a master road use agreement and a \$50,000 bond with Rocky View County. Companies, at their own cost, must maintain hauling routes on an ongoing basis to the satisfaction of the County including dust control, replenishment of gravel, grading of gravel and repair of surface or sub-surface damage as a result of hauling operations. Where required, calcium chloride or water is sprayed on the roads to provide a harder surface and reduce dust. To date, Rocky View County has not needed to access the bond of any LIPG operating company.



NOISE REDUCTION

LIPG members make a special effort to reduce noise by scheduling louder activities during appropriate working hours, positioning noisy equipment to direct noise away from residences and avoiding the use of engine retarder brakes in residential and urban areas.
